Being Ready



INTRODUCTION

“For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever.” 1 John 2:16, 17.

Circumstances in today’s world are taking a turn that makes people’s hearts tremble for fear. Violence that was at one time confined to the evening’s news about some far-off place is now happening in one’s own town and even next door. Life seems much more fragile than it once was, and one’s thoughts may quickly change from planning for a supposedly peaceful life in a predictable world to coping with frightening things that once seemed unthinkable.

God’s people are blessed to have “a more sure word of prophecy.” In the studies for this Youth Inspiration Week, we want to consider, first, where the world is headed. This is not for the purpose of somehow trying to scare people into the heavenly kingdom, for fear is not a motive that can endure. Rather, it is to help us grasp how God will resolve the conflict between good and evil that is centered in this world. After that, we will study about the holy, eternal principles that are valid in all places and under all circumstances.

In 1966, Robert W. Olson prepared a compilation of the writings of Sister Ellen G. White, titled *The Crisis Ahead*, containing 21 chapters that constitute a list of the world’s final events. After reviewing that list, we will examine the concepts behind Jesus’ words in Matthew 24:44: “Be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh.”

We want to know how to pass safely from this sinful world into the eternal kingdom of light. We serve a God of design, not a god of chance, so we can by faith be sure of our destiny if our trust is in God, even when this world and everything in it collapses and passes away.

The youth leader in every church is encouraged to print as many copies of this booklet as he needs so every young person has his or her own copy. Also, this Youth Inspiration Week is a good time to train the young people for service by giving them opportunities to express themselves fully and to lead the discussions. We also ask every local church, field, and union to support the General Conference Youth Department with regular offerings.

FORMING ONE'S CHARACTER

Why is it so important to consider who we are and who we want to be? Read the following quotations, and discuss how each person's mind and character are formed.

"The mind will never cease to be active. It is open to influences, good or bad. As the human countenance is stamped by the sunbeam on the polished plate of the artist, so are thoughts and impressions stamped on the mind of the child; and whether these impressions are of the earth earthy, or moral and religious, they are

well-nigh ineffaceable. When reason is awakening, the mind is most susceptible; and so the very first lessons are of great importance. These lessons have a powerful influence in the formation of character.” –*Counsels to Parents, Teachers, and Students*, p. 143.

“There are various erratic characters that are wholly unlike Jesus, and that are within the church of Christ; but unless they will submit to become as clay in the hands of the potter, and will be willing to receive the heavenly mold, and be shaped into such vessels as God shall choose to make them, they will always bear their deformity of character, always be vessels unto dishonor, and will never receive the finishing touch of immortality. No deficiency of character will be immortalized and mar heaven with its imperfection.” –*Review and Herald*, November 20, 1894.

CARRYING RESPONSIBILITIES

“God would have us students as long as we remain in this world, ever learning and bearing responsibility. We should be diligent and apt, and ready to teach others by precept and example that which we have learned;...” –*Review and Herald*, April 17, 1888.

What blessings come, and to whom, when one is willing to bear burdens for God? What does this have to do with learning to trust God? Share your thoughts about this in conjunction with the quotation below.

“My dear brethren and sisters in Iowa, the Lord is calling upon you to come to your senses. Awake to a realization of your responsibilities. God has given to every man his work. You have a most earnest work to do. You may live lives of usefulness. Learn all that you can, and then be a blessing to others by imparting a knowledge of truth. Let every one do according to his several ability, willingly sharing in the bearing of burdens.

“Let us in the name of the Lord press perseveringly forward in the race for eternal life. We have a great work to do in enlightening our own souls and in living up to a higher standard. Let us place a proper estimate on the preciousness of a knowledge of the truth. Then we shall have a clearer understanding in regard to God’s goodness to us and our obligations to others. While seeking to save the lost, let us keep our minds constantly uplifted in prayer for divine guidance. We are not to look to men, but are to behold Jesus. Let us not lose our spirituality. Christ desires His people to be greatly revived by the Holy Spirit.” –*Manuscript Releases*, vol. 16, p. 348.

Share an experience you have had in which God gave you special (supernatural) support in carrying out a task for which you were responsible.

But does this occur only once in a while? Read Philippians 4:13 and John 15:4-7, and look for the concept that God is supplying supernatural help to His children all the time and would supply much more if they would just ask for it. Then read and highlight the same idea in the quotations below.

“Our heavenly Father has a thousand ways to provide for us of which we know nothing. Those who accept the one principle of making the service of God supreme, will find perplexities vanish, and a plain path before their feet.” –*The Ministry of Healing*, p. 481.

‘Their warfare is not to be waged against flesh and blood, but ‘against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rulers of this darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places.’ Ephesians 6:12, R.V. They are to contend with supernatural forces, but they are assured of supernatural help. All the intelligences of heaven are in this army. And more than angels are in the ranks. The Holy Spirit, the representative of the Captain of the Lord’s host, comes down to direct the battle. Our infirmities may be many, our sins and mistakes grievous; but the grace of God is for all who seek it with contrition. The power of Omnipotence is enlisted in behalf of those who trust in God.” –*The Desire of Ages*, p. 352.

SUPERNATURAL SUPPORT-TODAY AND TOMORROW

It is important to view our lives through “spiritual glasses,” knowing that “We are engaged in a mighty conflict, and it will become more close and determined, as we near the final struggle. We have a sleepless adversary, and he is constantly at work upon human minds that have not had a personal experience in the teachings of the people of God.” –*Selected Messages*, book 2, p. 102. Discuss how to (1) “practice the presence of God” now in your day-to-day activities so you will (2) automatically trust Him both when something severe happens and when the final events break upon the world.

“It is in a crisis that character is revealed. When the earnest voice proclaimed at midnight, ‘Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him,’ and the sleeping virgins were roused from their slumbers, it was seen who had made preparation for the event. Both parties were taken unawares; but one was prepared for the emergency, and the other was found without preparation. So now, a sudden and unlooked-for calamity, something that brings the soul face to face with death, will show whether there is any real faith in the promises of God. It will show whether the soul is sustained by grace. The great final test comes at the close of human probation, when it will be too late for the soul’s need to be supplied.” –*Christ’s Object Lessons*, p. 412.

LOVE FOR HOLY THINGS

“Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. A DISRESPECTFUL, CARNAL WORLD

PRIMARY DIVERSIONS

Human desires and self-indulgence take many young people away from the church and even from God. Not finding what they are looking for within the ranks of God's people, they are attracted by young people of other faiths or no faith at all. God's call to spirituality can be trumped by the desire for a human relationship. And there are even greater things at stake. Highlight and share what you consider most important in the following quotation.

"What ought every Christian to do when brought into the trying position which tests the soundness of religious principle? With a firmness worthy of imitation he should say frankly: 'I am a conscientious Christian. I believe the seventh day of the week to be the Sabbath of the Bible. Our faith and principles are such that they lead in opposite directions. We cannot be happy together, for if I follow on to gain a more perfect knowledge of the will of God, I shall become more and more unlike the world and assimilated to the likeness of Christ. If you continue to see no loveliness in Christ, no attractions in the truth, you will love the world, which I cannot love, while I shall love the things of God, which you cannot love. Spiritual things are spiritually discerned. Without spiritual discernment you will be unable to see the claims of God upon me, or to realize my obligations to the Master whom I serve; therefore you will feel that I neglect you for religious duties. You will not be happy; you will be jealous on account of the affections which I give to God, and I shall be alone in my religious belief. When your views shall change, when your heart shall respond to the claims of God, and you shall learn to love my Saviour, then our relationship may be renewed.'

"The believer thus makes a sacrifice for Christ which his conscience approves, and which shows that he values eternal life too highly to run the risk of losing it. He feels that it would be better to remain unmarried than to link his interest for life with one who chooses the world rather than Jesus, and who would lead away from the cross of Christ." -*The Adventist Home*, pp. 67, 68.

TRUSTING GOD

Many young people have the thought that since God hasn't given them what they want, they need to go get it for themselves. Jobs and spouses are mainly what they seek. For the sake of earthly employment, some people sacrifice God's holy day of rest and His holy way of life. To have a spouse, they are willing to give up their faith. LIVING BY FAITH

CHANGE OF HEART

The natural, sinful human heart is fickle and self-centered, changing quickly from one selfish desire to another. God knows this and urges, “My son, give Me thine heart.” Proverbs 23:26. When we do that, He gives us a new heart (Ezekial 36:26) so we will not just follow our natural human desires, which are controlled by the power of evil, self-centered, and destructive. “When a sinner once beholds the love of the Father, as seen in the sacrifice of His Son, and yields to the divine influence, a change of heart takes place, and henceforth Christ is all and in all.” –*Conflict and Courage*, p. 341.

FOUR RELIGIOUS STREAMS

But faith is not just religion. The enemy of souls wants people to be religious, as long as they accept ideas that are opposed to real faith. All religion falls into one of four ways of thinking about how to obtain eternal life:

- **Works** (one must do something to avoid divine wrath and obtain divine favor—*paganism*)
- **Faith and Works** (one must accept the divine sacrifice and perform acts of penance and good deeds—*Catholicism*)
- **Faith Only** (one must accept Jesus Christ as his Saviour, and nothing more—*false Protestantism*)
- **Faith That Works** (when one accepts Jesus Christ as his Saviour, Jesus abides in him and performs His holy will in him—*God's church*)

ALL ALONE—WITH GOD

"I have trodden the winepress alone; and of the people there was none with Me:..." Isaiah 63:3.

UPHOLDING TRUTH

"In his ministry, Paul was often compelled to stand alone. He was specially taught of God and dared make no concessions that would involve principle. “When Jesus ascended to heaven, He appointed men as His representatives to carry forward, in His name, the work which He had begun, promising them that, as they engaged in this work, they should have special help and strength. In view of this promise, and the great love of God for man, it has been difficult for many to understand why He permits His followers to suffer as the martyrs did through the Satanic cruelty of men professing to be the successors of Christ. This question troubled me for years. But when I saw how the angels of God hovered over these precious jewels, even as they hovered over the cross of Christ, my feelings were changed. By faith these faithful ones saw the crown of immortal glory, the white robe, and the palm branch of victory, and Jesus, their loved Commander, watching over them. I then understood why our heavenly Father permits temptations, trials, and afflictions, to come to His loved ones. These are designed to give His children a deeper sense of His presence and providential care. They are also His providences, visitations of mercy, to bring back those who stray from His side. The peace that passeth understanding is not for those who try to shirk trials and self-denial. We cannot fully appreciate peace and joy in Christ, and the gift of eternal life, unless we are called to make some sacrifice to obtain these great blessings.” –*Review and Herald*, March 16, 1886.

“If we would enter into the joy of our Lord, in the kingdom above, we must here partake of His self-denial and sacrifice, drawing nourishment from the word of God, whose sustenance is as enduring as eternity.” –*Medical Ministry*, September 1, 1892.

“Not with sorrow, but with rejoicing, should they meet persecution. Each fiery trial is God’s agent for their refining. Each is fitting them for their work as co-laborers with Him. Each conflict has its place in the great battle for righteousness, and each will add to the joy of their final triumph. Having this in view, the test of their faith and patience will be cheerfully accepted rather than dreaded and

avoided. Anxious to fulfill their obligation to the world, fixing their desire upon the approval of God, His servants are to fulfill every duty, irrespective of the fear or the favor of men.” –*The Desire of Ages*, p. 306.
